



INFORMED CONSENT FOR TREATMENT WITH EVENITY (ROMOSUZUMAB)

Read the medication guide that comes with Evenity before you start it at Evenity.com. Talk to your doctor if you have any questions.

What is Evenity?

Evenity is a medicine used for the treatment of postmenopausal women with osteoporosis at high risk for fracture.

What is osteoporosis?

Osteoporosis is a disease in which the bones become thin and weak, increasing the chance of having a fracture. Osteoporosis usually causes no symptoms until a fracture happens.

How does it work?

Unlike previously available medicines for treating osteoporosis, Evenity works differently with a dual effect by simultaneously increasing bone formation while reducing resorption.

What are the possible side effects of Evenity, warnings, precautions and contraindications while using Evenity?

Heart attack, stroke - Evenity may increase the risk of myocardial infarction (Heart attack), Stroke, cardiovascular death. It should not be initiated in patients who have had a heart attack or stroke within the preceding year. Please tell your doctor if you have had this.

- You should monitor for signs and symptoms of myocardial infarction and stroke and seek prompt medical attention if symptoms occur.
- If a myocardial infarction or stroke occurs during therapy, Evenity should be discontinued.

Contraindications: Evenity is contraindicated in patients with hypocalcemia.

- Your blood calcium level must be checked and treated before you receive Evenity.
- Take supplemental calcium and vitamin D while on treatment with Evenity

Hypersensitivity: Hypersensitivity reactions, including angioedema, erythema multiforme, dermatitis, rash, and urticaria have occurred in Evenity-treated patients. If an anaphylactic or other clinically significant allergic reaction occurs, initiate appropriate therapy and discontinue further use of Evenity.

Osteonecrosis of the Jaw bone (ONJ): ONJ, which can occur spontaneously, is generally associated with tooth extraction and/or local infection with delayed healing, and has been reported in patients receiving Evenity.

- Please tell your dentist while starting treatment with Evenity. A 6 monthly dental checkup is recommended while continuing treatment with Evenity to ensure good dental health and avoidance of any unforeseen dental procedures.

- A routine oral exam should be performed prior to initiation of Evenity.
- Concomitant administration of drugs (chemotherapy, bisphosphonates, denosumab, angiogenesis inhibitors, and corticosteroids) or poor oral hygiene, pre-existing dental disease or infection; or cancer, radiotherapy, may further increase the risk of ONJ.

Atypical Femoral Fractures:

- Atypical low-trauma fractures of the femoral shaft have been reported in patients receiving Evenity.
- Please immediately report new or unusual thigh, hip, or groin pain.

Adverse Reactions: The most common adverse reactions (= 5%) are arthralgia and headache. Evenity is an antibody, hence there is potential for immunogenicity.

DO NOT RECEIVE EVENITY IF YOU:

- Have low blood calcium levels.
- Are allergic to romosozumab or any of the ingredients in Evenity.
- Pregnancy and breast feeding – You should not take Evenity if you are pregnant or are breast feeding.

How will I receive Evenity?

Evenity is an injection that will be given to you by a healthcare professional injected under your skin (subcutaneous), administered monthly for 12 doses. You should also take calcium and vitamin D.
